

Response to Complaint from Competitor #33 (Denis Dawidziuk)

In response to your complaint and request to be scored in task No. 1 to the goal coordinates, rather than the position of the set target, my answer is as follows:

I will not score you to the goal coordinates for the following reasons. The Rule that you quote in your complaint (Rule 12.1.2) refers to a "goal", not to targets, and does not apply in this case. This Rule refers, for example, to situations where a goal selected by a competitor, such as a road intersection on the map, no longer exists because the map is out of date.


The relevant Rule to be considered in the particular case that is the subject of your complaint is Rule 12.5.

Rule 12.5 states that a target is a "*prominent cross displayed in the vicinity of a goal.....*". This Rule also states "*A competitor reaching a goal where an expected target is not displayed should aim for the goal coordinate*".

In the case that is the subject of your complaint a target was displayed in the vicinity of the specified goal (within 120m of the goal coordinate). Therefore according to Rule 12.5, "*any measurements are made from the target, not from the goal*".

I will therefore score you, and all other competitors, to the target and not the goal coordinate, as specified in the Rules.

Hereby, I would like to place a complaint about Task N°1, Hesitation waltz, concerning the first target with coordinates, as for the task data sheet: 5552 / 1928. In fact, the coordinates of the target where: 5554 / 1915, which constitutes a difference between the two targets which is greater than 100 m. This is, in my opinion, an infringement to the Rule 12.1.2, which states that: "If the goal has ceased to exist and no similar goal is seen within 100m, the competitor should aim for the coordinates".
